Is the idyll of self-sufficiency merely the mirror image of capitalist individualism? In an attempt to understand what we would really be letting ourselves in for if we went 'back to the land', this *Critical Camp* will explore the relation between labour and freedom, and will involve discussion and participative activities revolving around manual labour and technology, and the difficulty of deciding where one ends and the other begins.
